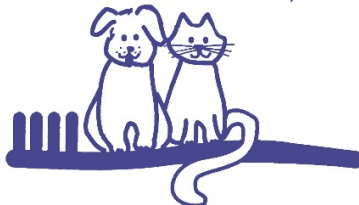

This two hour lecture will target the education of veterinarians and review all major aspects of a thorough oral exam in canine patients of all ages. We will begin with a review of the canine dental formula and directional nomenclature and then delve into the steps of oral cavity assessment. The objective of this lecture is to highlight important features of the awake oral exam in puppies, juvenile and adult dogs and enable the general practitioner to make clinical decisions that can improve the overall quality of the animal's life.
